Purple Cloud Glass Jardinière in 1935 Markhbeinn catalogue - who made it?

Hello Siegmar,

Thank you for sending the latest edition of Pressglas-Korrespondenz PK 2004-2. We have already found many articles of interest. In particular the 1935 Markhbeinn catalogue. We have been trying to find when and who made the No. 11371 Jardinières as we have an example in Purple Cloud glass. From the Markhbeinn catalogue we know they were made in the 1930s in Bohemia. It would be very useful to know at what factory it was made.

Hello Chris,

until now I could not find any hint where Your cloud glass bowl could be produced.

Most of all pressed glass in catalogue Markhbeinn 1935 came from Josef Inwald, Teplice. Inwald was about 1935 the most progressive Czech glasswork, f.i. look at Barolac glass, but there they never produced cloud glass (we do not know one single glass).

Rindskopf had sold his glassworks in Czechoslovakia to Inwald and had went to England about 1932 (look for Thistlewood, <http://www.carnival-glass.net/>) and there had overtaken Molineaux.

Some articles - very few - in catalogue Markhbeinn 1935 came from S. Reich & Co. and maybe other glassworks. 1934 S. Reich went to bankruptcy and part of the press moulds went to glasswork Libochovice. We

were not able to find any hint about glass which was produced in Libochovice before 1948. The only glasswork in Czechoslovakia which produced cloud glass was S. Reich & Co., see Your own website and PK 2003-4, Stewart, SG, Cloud Glass von S. Reich & Co. / Českomoravské Sklárný von 1925 bis 1935.

Maybe the cloud glass bowl was produced by S. Reich before 1934 or by Libochovice after 1934?

Thank you for your reply. I have attached a picture of the bowl as requested. It is 21 cm in diameter and 9 cm high. We have had a look at the catalogues S. Reich & Co., but cannot see this design. Also, as far as we are aware Reich did not make Purple Cloud glass.
