\$14,850 was paid for a rare Holly Amber pedestal toothpick holder at a Mike Clum auction March 18, 2015. The toothpick holder was made by the Indiana Tumbler and Goblet Works of Greentown, Indiana. Only three are known. It is 5 inches high. The glass, originally called Golden Agate was made in 1902 and 1903. It is a yellow glass that is semi-opaque opalescent in plain sections of the pattern. Because the yellow (amber) glass is where the pattern shows holly leaves and berries the collectors call pieces Holly Amber.


